



Mr. Lowell Thomas

The Travelogue.

Authorised by the Secretary of the Army and the Secretary of the Navy of the United States Government, Mr. Lowell Thomas, assisted by Colonel W. C. Hayes and a staff of photographers, journeyed over sixty thousand miles gathering material for a series of travelogues. They were attached to the allied forces in Europe, Asia and Africa, and were with them from the Orkney Islands, to the forbidden deserts of Arabia, from New York to Jerusalem, from Rome to Khar-toum, from Paris to Salonika, and from Cairo to Berlin. He was the first person to enter the holy land of the Mohammedans with a cinema camera. After the signing of the armistice he was the first to visit Kiel, Hamburg, Berlin and other parts of Germany, and bring back the pictorial story of the German revolution.

Prior to his arrival in India Mr. Lowell Thomas toured Australia for five months at the invitation of The Commonwealth Government. Before starting on his present world tour he appeared for one year at the Royal Opera House, Convent Garden, London, and the Century Theatre, New York.

The Lowell Thomas' world tour is under the auspices of the London branch of the English-Speaking Union whose object is to "To draw together in the bond of comradeship the English speaking peoples of the world."

Mr. Lowell Thomas has presented "With Allenby in Palestine and Lawrence in Arabia" before two million people in five continents. His associate speakers, Mr. Dale Carnegie and Lt.-Col. C. C. Cooper, have presented the travelogue before over one million more. Nothing like this success has ever been achieved before. During the past winter the Lowell Thomas Travelogue organization also presented Sir Rose and Sir Keith Smith in person, at Philharmonic Hall, London, with the illustrated narrative of their epoc-making flight half way around the world from England to Australia.

The primary object of Mr. Lowell Thomas' present tour of India is the preparation of a new production on the developement of the British Empire in Asia. This will be presented in the British Isles and in America during the coming year.

FROM India to Malta and Egypt by way of the Panama Canal and the Mediterranean. From Cairo to Palestine by battleplane. Looking down on the Pyramids from the sky. Flying across the Suez Canal. Driving the Turks from Beersheba, the ancient home of Abraham. The ancient Philistine city of Gaza, where Samson wooed Delilah. Three thousand feet above the Plains of Philistia. Mughar Hill. Modern Jewish colonies. "The Army of Allah." Looking down on Jaffa from our airplane. The battlefield where the Indians defeated the Turks, and where David slew Goliath. Advancing on Jerusalem. Climbing into the clouds above the Plains of Sharon. The Jaffa-Jerusalem road from two thousand feet in the sky. Allenby's army passing Ramleh, where the armies of Godfrey de Bouillon and Richard Cœur de Lion camped eight centuries ago. A modern Rebecca at the Well scene. A refreshing disaster on the way to the Holy City. Plunging seven thousand feet towards Bethlehem in a spinning nose dive. French and British at the Church of the Nativity. The capture of Nebi Samwil and the fall of Jerusalem. The surrender of the Holy City. Jerusalem from the air. Looking down from the clouds at the Mount of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Solomon's Temple, and the Holy Sepulchre. Entry of the Deliverers. Indian troops viewing the sights of Jerusalem. Mohammedan troops from India on guard at the Mosque of Omar. Palace of the former German Kaiser. The most blasphemous picture in the world. Historic scenes on the summit of the Mount of Olives.
